

Located within the Historical District of Addison, the Addison Historical Museum includes the 1892 Balzer House which features displays on local history, the 1932 Coach House which presents dioramas and exhibits on Addison's farming heritage, and the 1893 Century House, once the home of Lutheran school teachers and their families, which is now restored to the late 19th to early 20th century period. Sheldon Peck was a radical abolitionist and an itinerant folk artist. Built in 1839, the Sheldon Peck Homestead is the oldest house in Lombard, the first school and a verified site on the National Park Service Underground Network to Freedom. 




